Mairi trained at London's Guildhall School of Music and toured Europe and Russia before returning home to Edinburgh in 1990 to start her apprenticeship in traditional music and song. She and her husband and collaborator Dave Francis are known as The Cast. Their most recent CD, Greengold, a collection of self penned and traditional material has received much praise. Mairi is now in her eighth year as MD of the community folk choir Sangstream, for which she has written numerous songs and arrangements. She also runs her own fiddle school, the Lismore Fiddle Retreat, and currently combines songwriting, teaching and performance. She was voted Scots singer of the year in 2008 and her version of Auld Lang Syne was used in the Sex and the City movie. She has something of a celebrity fan base, including Sarah Jessica Parker, and has sung for President Clinton and Sean Connery.

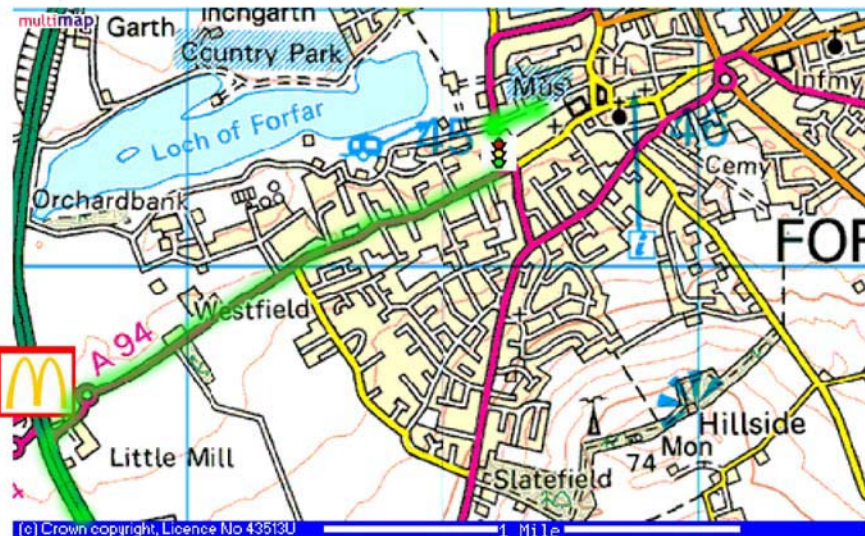
## Directions to St Margaret's Church, Forfar.

From the A90 Dundee To Aberdeen dual-carriageway, take the A929 junction to Forfar. There is a McDonalds 'restaurant' at this junction.

Follow Glamis Road straight in to the town until you reach the traffic lights at the end of West High Street.



St. Margaret's Church is straight ahead over these lights, on the left, between the bank and the post office. However, to park your car, turn left at the traffic lights and the first right, signposted for the Myre Car Park. This is a free car park and you can leave your car all day. From the car park, a small lane / steps leads up the side of the Guide Hall to St. Margaret's Church. At the top of the steps, opposite the postal depot, the entrance to the church hall is the first gate on your right.
